

**BACKGROUND, MISSION
AND VISION**

Atlanta Christian College is a private four-year college located near Atlanta, Ga. Founded in 1937, the College enrolls more than 900 students in both traditional and adult degree programs. ACC is affiliated with the Christian Churches and Churches of Christ.

Atlanta Christian College's mission is to educate students for Christ-centered service and leadership throughout the world. ACC's educational goal is the development of the total person. The curriculum – biblical and theological studies, arts and sciences, and various professional studies – and the learning environment are designed to encourage students to grow spiritually, intellectually, socially, physically and professionally.

CAMPUS LOCATION

The 50-acre campus is located in East Point, Georgia, about four miles from the Atlanta airport and ten minutes south of downtown Atlanta. The College's board of trustees is currently in the process of selecting a new location for the main campus to accommodate further growth; a satellite location has opened in Peachtree City, Ga.
